spent his early childhood with his maternal grandmother of blessed memory in Shangev-ya, Kwande Local Government Area of Benue State. During this time he did and completed his primary education at RCM Primary school Yaji. He attended and completed his Junior Secondary school at Tofi Memory Grammar School in Gboko. He proceeded to St. James Minor Seminary, Yandev for his senior secondary school where he graduated with distinctions as the Overall Best Graduating Student in 1998. He holds a Bachelor of Philosophy (B. Phil) Degree in Philosophy of the Pontifical Urbaniana University, Rome and a Master of Arts (M.A) Degree in African-Christian Studies from the Benue State University, Makurdi and another Master of Arts (M.A.) Degree in Social and Political Philosophy and a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree in Social and Political Philosophy all from the ONE and ONLY University of Nigeria, Nsukka. By the grace of God, Dr Oliver Tersoo Agundu is the first to hold a Doctor of Philosophy Degree (Ph.D.) in Social and Political Philosophy in Northern Nigeria.

rofessor Olayemi Akinwumi PhD, AvHF, FHSN, FNAL is a Distinguished Professor of History. He started his higher education at the University of Ilorin where he obtained his Bachelor's degree in 1985 followed by Master's and PhD degrees in History from the same University. He is a Fellow of the Historical Society of Nigeria (HSN), Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Letter (NAL), and former President of the Historical Society - first Academic Society in Nigeria.

Professor Akinwumi began his academic career also at the University of Ilorin and rose to become a Senior Lecturer in 1996. He then proceeded to Institut fur Ethonogie, Freie Universitat, Berlin, Germany from 1999 to 2004. On his return to Nigeria, he joined the services of the Nasarawa State University, Keffi where he served in various capacities, such as Head of Department, Deputy Dean, Dean, 2-term Chairman of Committee of Deans and Directors, Senate Representative in the Governing Council where he served in many committees, Director Institute of Governance and Development Studies, Director Research and Publications, and Dean School of Postgraduate Studies and Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academics).

He is an erudite scholar with over 70 publications in national and international journals. One Tree, Different Branches: A Profiling of Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu



Early life of Tor Joe Iorapuu

oing a profiling for a great human being like Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu is not a task for a young academic like me who is almost three decades younger than the subject on the spotlight both in academics and in age. Notwithstanding, attempting a profiling of the subject with the title

One Tree Different Branches: A Profiling Professor of Tor Joe Iorapuu to me best describes the subject in question. This notwithstanding, but as a young academic of Masev extraction who have known and interacted with the subject for almost two decades is convinced to carry out a historical coverage or profiling of the man professor Tor Joe Iorapuu. Professor Joe Tor Iorapuu was born to the family of late Iorapuu Ibya of Mbalav community of Gwer East government area of Benue state, Nigeria. He received his elementary education at St Patrick's Primary school Taraku. While in St Parick's Primary School, the young Tor was the school's goalkeeper of the team Mosquitoes owned by the late bishop Athanasius Usugh. Tor upon receiving his first school certificate, he proceeded to Government Secondary School Katsina Ala where he obtained his WASC. While in Government College, Tor was made the house captain and he continued with his sportsmanship and this made him an all-rounder in the college. He was one of the most popular fellows in the college and this aimed him array of friends transcending the shores of Benue.

The young Tor being a lover of knowledge enrolled for an NCE programme with College of Education Katsina Ala combining English / Theatre Arts. In the college, Tor Iorapuu was one of the best actors in the Department partaking in different plays as both lead and supporting actor. Tor graduated from the college of education in 1984 as one of the best actors and most populous candidate on campus in that year. The search for more knowledge further took the zealous Tor to the



prestigious University of Jos. In Jos, Tor continued with Theatre Arts, a course he adored and cherished with all sense of compassion. In the University of Jos, Tor rode on fortune wings because of his background at the College of education; he was again one of the leading actors both in stage and dance performances at the University of Jos. Tor graduated with a Second Class Upper honors degree in Theatre Arts. Tor proceeded for his NYSC in Lagos and while in camp, he was still one of the leading figures in the camp in that year. Tor Iorapuu was the Director of the NYSC drama unit in his platoon and his directorial and choreographed performances earned his platoon some awards to behold.

Academic life of Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu

or secured appointment with the Department of Theatre and Communications Arts now Department of Theatre and Film Arts with the University of Jos as a Graduate Assistant. Through the guidance of Professors Iyorwuese Harry Hagher, Saint Gbilekaa, Amali S. O.O and Irene Agunloye, Tor enrolled for a Master's programme graduating within fifteen months with a tall WGPA. As a young academic, Tor served as a level Coordinator, Departmental Examinations Officer and Faculty Examinations Officer respectively.

Tor was fortunate and got an opportunity to travel abroad for a PhD in Communications Arts but just at this same point in his life and career, Tor



was actively involved in a programme with Mac-Arthur foundation and he felt it was better to continue with the programme because of the impart the programme was making on local communities across the length and breadth of Nigeria. I will return to this in as I progress with the profiling. Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu throughout his academic career remained a committed and astute scholar of our time; his published articles are in both local and international journals across the globe. Tor has remained one of the most traveled scholars in this country who has attended, presented and contributed numerous chapters in several local and international conferences across all continents of the universe. His commitment as a University Professor has brought him so much firm within and outside the University.

Within the purview of the academic circle, Tor rose through the ranks and he has equally held virtually all positions in the University system. He served in several committees in the University system. To begin with, Tor served as member, Departmental Examination Board, Examinations Officer, Coordinator, Directorate of American Corner of the University of Jos, Head of Department and Dean Faculty of Arts respectively in the University of Jos. Tor also served as External Examiner to many Universities in Nigeria at both undergraduate and post graduate levels. In the year 2020, Professor Tor Iorapuu was appointed the Vice-Chancellor of Benue State University, Makurdi. I will return to his exploits as the Vice-Chancellor of Benue State University later as I progress with the profiling.

Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu as an Activist

eyond mentoring and shaping young people in the University as one of the core values of an academic, Professor Joe Tor Iorapuu is one of the few Theatre scholars in Nigeria who have thoroughly utilized the theatre instrument in pursuit of a just and an egalitarian society. Before joining the university system as an academic, Tor was a great unionist as an undergraduate student. Through the experiences of fighting injustices and demanding for favorable social welfare packages for the students, Tor and many of his kinds ensured that water and other social amenities that aid learning were provided the students on the campus. Upon joining the University of Jos as a Graduate Assistant in the year 1989, Tor continued with the struggle. Through Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) a university based union for

academic staff of Universities in Nigeria provided the platform where activism was projected and promoted. In the wake of Tor's early life in the university, it was a period when ASUU was at its peak fighting the military government and demanding for improved welfare for staff and students in Nigerian universities. Tor was one of the leading voices in the University of Jos' branch of ASUU. The struggle was to ensure that both staff and students got all that they needed to improve their welfare. This struggle traversed through decades yet, Tor was untiring.

As a theatre scholar, Tor developed interest in Theatre for Development TfD at an early stage at the College of Education Katsina Ala and later with his involvement with Professor Steve Abah, one of the leading scholars in the area of TfD, propelled Tor more into the life of activism. This is because, through TfD programmes like the Nigerian popular Theatre Alliance, Tor and others traversed all nooks and crannies of the country empowering local communities and ensuring that the people are well educated and informed about the social realities in their communities and around the country. Tor has remained a quiet and consensus builder of people across age divide. Hence, the description "One Tree Different Branches", he is never a selector of any kind of people to mingle with and he is always on ground to share his time, talent and treasure with the people for the promotion of peace and social justice.

As a functional activist that traversed all parts of the country working with local communities through theatre for development approach, Tor saw so many limitations owing to the time frame giving to each TfD activity in all local communities visited. With this in mind and going with his passion of emancipating the people and building their capacity for a better and functional society, Tor took his activism outside the conventional theatre practice within the academic circle and went into the trenches meeting with local people. This commitment and drive birthed the establishment of a non-governmental organization called Youth Adolescents and Reflection Action Centre (YARAC), based in Jos Plateau State, Nigeria. This platform gave Tor a more accommodating disposition to mingle with the locals so as to empower them more appropriately about issues that bother on their development. In the first instance, the Centre was poised to empowering young people on sexuality education. Had I Known a play was written about young people and the play traversed all the regions of the country



educating and empowering young people about sex education. The radicalism in the thematic handling of the play's subject matter gave Tor a more engaging platform with the young people. Through the play, young people were becoming more open to narrating their problems and how it affects them.

Again, after the 2007 general election, YARAC saw the gaps in the elections and decided to use its centre to empower the people by providing them with the needed voter and political education. Through YARAC, Tor went to several communities in Nasarawa state, Plateau State and Benue State engaging the people and providing voter education and sensitizing the people about the way and manner in which politics and votes are casted elsewhere. The campaign and voter education as fronted by YARAC revealed some missing gaps that were felt before, during and after the elections as narrated by the communities. This gave birth to yet another play by Tor titled April 1421. The play was a response to the narratives gotten from the field. The masses have outlined several bottle necks that were responsible for the killings before, during and after the 2007 general elections

For over two decades and counting, YARAC has trained, retrained and empowered over a hundred thousand young people in the States of Plateau, Benue, Nasarawa, Lagos Enugu, Jigawa, Katsina and many other states through its numerous intervention programmes. This shows that Tor, is indeed an activist who believed in the emancipation of the young people and



empowering them to be self-sufficient towards the betterment of the nation. Professor Tor's active life in the civil society spans four decades, unlike other social activists, Tor is a pure breed social networker with both theory and practice. Tor is trained as Theatre Artist with a bias in Applied and Social Theatre, therefore, he has used this medium to mobilize and organize communities into action. Through theatre and his experience in activism, Tor has made tremendous impact in building and mentoring young people across all divide.

It is imperative to note that the motivation to radicalize young people and make them selfsufficient in the society was propelled by Tor's reading of Soul Alinsky's "Rules for Radicals" and this led to his introduction courses such as Theatre and Community Organizing at both undergraduate and post graduate levels and Theatre, Democracy and Social Justice in the Department of Theatre and Film Arts, University of Jos. To conclude this section of a profiling on this quintessential scholar, it will be sacrilegious if I fail to mention that Tor's passion in activism propelled him in to writing a his PhD theses in "Theatre, Community Organizing and Development Action: The Role of Intermediary Organization in Nigeria", Tor established in his theses that indeed theatre and civil societies have done a great deal in reshaping our repugnant and repulsive society through development communication in many areas.

Professor Tor's Pinch in Politics

rofessor Tor Joe Iorapuu became worried with the retrogression in Benue state and opted to dive into politics so as to redefine the status quo. He was particular of building on the dream and legacies of the late Sir. Aper Aku and the Late Fr. Moses Adasu whose blue print was and still remained a pointer to putting Benue on the world's mad if judiciously followed. This aspiration to rebuild Benue state came about in 2018. During this period, Tor left the University of Jos and came back to Benue to contest for governorship under Peoples Democratic Party. Tor's slogan was #Benuewillriseagain#. Tor was one of the poorest personalities in terms of money bag politics that has characterized the Nigerian political space. Yet, Tor became the most popular Governorship candidate in the State. His popularity spread through all the ends of the state and this was tied to his social and philanthropic lifestyle that he had built amongst his contemporaries in years past.

Professor Tor Iorapuu visited and consulted widely with every big name in the political scene in Benue and every local government area in the state. Young people took the project personal and it became glaring that Tor was going to get the ticket for his party. The unfortunate happened when the then seating governor at the time left his party, the All Progressive Congress and rejoined Peoples Democratic Party; all the aspirants including Tor were requested to step down for the governor with the caveat that he had the party structure. Indeed, all the aspirants had to comply. Many of the delegates were for Tor and they insisted that he should continue with the struggle but the humble Tor decided not to wage a war against the leadership of party and he equally steeped aside like all the other aspirants. Tor went back to the university where he teaches to continue with his profession of mentoring and shaping young people.

Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu as an Administrator

he administrative journey of Professor Tor is in many layers and I would want to state very emphatically that, as a university professor, Tor has handled all positions in the university. To begin with, Tor served as a level Coordinator in charge of a level; he graduated into the Departmental Examinations Officer and handles the position for close to a decade. Tor was made the Coordinator of the American Centre of the University of Jos. Thereafter, he became the Head of Department, Department of Theatre and Film Arts, as the chair of the department, Tor, demystified headship by running an open door policy where every members of the department was a stakeholder in the administration. Tor was elected as the Dean of the Faculty of Arts, as the Dean, Tor ensured that the yearnings and aspirations of the members of staff were projected.

Professor Tor as the Dean of Arts attracted and signed a collaboration deals with Kenyata University Kenya and Goethe University Germany with the support of the Vice-Chancellor. The collaboration from Kenya was to allow exchange of students and staff while that of Goethe University in Germany was for the Department of Theatre and Film Arts of the University of Jos in conjunction with National Film Institute to run a master's programme in Film Culture and Archiving. Tor in collaboration with the then Vice-Chancellor of the University of Jos ensured that all these programmes kicked started with Tor as the Dean of Arts before

he was stolen away from University of Jos and made the Vice-Chancellor of Benue State University. As the Vice-Chancellor of Benue State University, Makurdi, Professor Tor, has brought tremendous administrative policies that are moving the university to greater highest. He has introduced new Faculties and Departments that are about to kick start in the 2022-2023 academic session. He has supervised and ensured the completion and commissioning of some remarkable TetFund projects in the University.

Professor Tor as a Socialist/Philanthropist

rofessor Tor Joe Iorapuu is a man of many layers and he has used his social lifestyle to attract friends for himself within and outside the shores of this country. Professor Tor is a fine gentleman that always lives an impression of love and unity in the mind of any personality he comes in contact with. Tor has the enigmatic and charismatic wherewithal to attract friends. He is one person that reads the minds of the people around him, sometimes, it seems as though Tor is prophetic in the way and manner he intervenes in matters concerning friends and brotherhood.

Despite his social standing in the society, Tor has remained a down to earth personality, ready to learn new ideas from people of all ranks. He is not just ready to learn, he is actually a fast learner and learns as fast as a computer processor. Tor's social/philanthropist live has taught him to be a single tree with different branches. This is because Tor has continued to be a strong source of support to many people who needs help. The thing to note is that Tor's kindness is second to none, he gives to those in need and even those who are not in need depending on the circumstances. He gives without looking back or expecting something in return.

Tor's social lifestyle and philanthropic nature has helped many Masev sons and daughters and even beyond. In fact, I made bold to state here very unequivocally that there is no single district in Masev land that has not benefited from Tor's benevolence in the area of securing admissions into the University of Jos in pursuit of better and higher education. This is what Tor does with all sense of humor and commitment to brotherhood. In his words, he will always say "When we are no longer here, who will replace us". This continually remains his passion for ensuring that Masev sons and daughters are admitted into their choice of course.



Through his benevolence, Tor has helped in the payment of tuition fee for Masev sons and daughters going in for law school at different points. Tor has also facilitated the appointment of many Masev sons into the University of Jos including my humble self and many others who are doing practically well in their chosen professions.

This socialist and philanthropic attributes in Professor Tor has continued to waxen as burning flames. He is untiring and remains passionate with his desire to continue to build an army of Masev professionals who can replace the current professional in all spheres of life.

Professor Tor and Family Life

Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu is a lovely family man, he is married to Lady Nnena Iorapuu who herself is a lecturer in the Department of

Social Science Education of the University of Jos. Sir and Lady Iorapuu are blessed with four lovely children who are all experts in their different endeavors. Tor is a dynamic and caring family man with a dynasty to his credit. Beside his immediate and extended family, Tor has many foster family members on his pay role.

He is a grandfather of four and still counting. A visit to the Tor's castle makes one understand what a perfect family is.

To conclude, I am forced to state unequivocally that a profiling of Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu and his career as an academic, a civil society activist and an administrator has given us a perceptible appreciation of the subject as a true son of Masev land who has distinguished himself in many aspects of life and still counting.

r. Achibi Samuel Dede was born in 1965 in Lagos, Nigeria. He attended Township School, Moscow Road, Port Harcourt, and the prestigious, American established Comprehensive Secondary School and the Federal Government College, Port Harcourt.

His interest in the Arts dates far back to his early years. He was a child actor at the Rivers State Council for Arts and Culture, and anchored children's programmes on Radio and Television, even as a ten year old.

In the 1983/1984 session, he gained admission into the University of Benin to study Theatre Arts. While in Theatre School, he established his own Theatre troupe, performing off and on campus, and got it signed on as the resident performing troupe at the Delta Steel Complex, Alaja and the National Institute for Oilpalm Research, Benin. He also scripted and acted in many of the then Bendel Television Play House Drama Series. During his student days in UNIBEN, he was President of the Theatre Arts Student Association and National Vice President of the Nigerian Universities Theatre Arts Students Association (NUTASA).

Upon his graduation in 1988, The National Youth Service Corp programme assigned him to the Nigerian Television College (NTA College) Jos, Plateau State. During the service year, in partnership with the NYSC and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) he established a Community Theatre Project which functioned in many rural areas of the State as Theatre for Development.

He had a brief part-time stint with the National Troupe of Nigeria under the legendary Baba Hubert Ogunde in 1989 before he was invited to join the Department of Creative Arts at the University of Port Harcourt by the theatre and Academic giant, Professor Ola Rotimi. At Uniport, he studied Comparative Literature and obtained his Masters (MA) and Doctorate (Ph.D.) degrees in Film Studies.

He is still a Lecturer in the Department of Theatre and Film Studies, where he teaches Acting, Voice and Speech Training and Film/Television Production. He has attended several training programmes and workshops and courses in South Africa, United Kingdom and the United States of America. He also attended the London School of Business and Finance in 2014, and has been a Visiting Scholar and Artist to the University of North Hampton, University of West Indies,

Jamaica, The University for the Creative Arts, United Kingdom and the London Film School.

As and an Industry Practitioner, Sam Dede has staged several plays and has made over 300 films in the capacity of Writer, Producer, Director and Actor. In 2006, he was inducted (First Set) into the Nigerian Filmmakers Hall of Fame. He has numerous Awards and Honours to his credit, including The African Movie Academy Award and many others locally and internationally.

Dr. Sam Dede holds Fellow Status in the National Association of Nigerian Theatre Arts Practitioners (NANTAP) Fellow- Institute of Management Consultants (FIMC). He is also a Chartered Management Consultant. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Corporate Administration and Member, Society of Nigerian Theatre Artists. He has been a member of the Management Committee of the Abuja National Carnival (Coordinator South-South). He was for six years the Artistic/Carnival Director of the Rivers State Carnival (CARNIRIV) and led the Rivers State Troupe to participate at the Notting-Hill Carnival, London, Uk in 2012,2013 and 2014. Sam Dede also served as the Director General of the Rivers State Tourism Development Agency from 2012-2015.

dediranmi, as his parents liked to call him, is the last son of his mother, Iyaafin Rebecca Onaolapo Abike-odi Ademiju-Bepo's eleven children, but the sixteenth child of his father, Omo-Oba Michael Komolafe Isola-aye Ademiju Ademiju-Bepo (both of blessed memory) of the Owa Bepo/Aromolaran Dynasty of Ilesa Kingdom. He was born on Thursday, the 17th

August, 1968 in Ilesa, Ilesa East Local Government Area in present day Osun State. He began his primary education at CAC Primary School, Sakasaka, Ejigbo, in 1973 and was transferred to St. Michael's Catholic Primary School, Yemetu Aladorin, Ibadan in 1977, when he joined his eldest sister and foster mother, Princess (Mrs.) Rachael Bolatito Adefunmike Olasoko (nee Ademiju) to begin a taste of urban life.

He earned the First School Leaving Certificate (FSLC) and gained admission into St. Patrick's Grammar School, SPACO, Orita-Bashorun, Ibadan in September 1979, where he was discovered early in Form One as a writer and an actor, even though he had participated in stage drama in the church and in primary

school as a child growing up. Graduating in 1984 with the WASC O'Level in June before his sixteenth birthday, and the GCE O'Level in November, his career path in the Humanities was carved for him, having been unable to make a credit pass in Mathematics and Biology. He wanted to study Law, but after two attempts at JAMB UME, first in 1985 and later in 1987, he opted for Theatre Arts at Nigeria's premier University, the University of Ibadan.

He became a 1991 University of Ibadan graduate of Media Arts, Playwriting & Directing (B.A. (Hons.) and 1994 in Dramatic Literature, Theory & Criticism (M.A.). His plays have won acclaim at the annual Nigerian Universities Theatre Arts Festival (NUTAF) as an

undergraduate student in 1990 and postgraduate in 1996. In his quest for excellence and in pursuit of his dream, he enrolled for the MPhil/PhD programme in Film Studies in 1995 and eventually was awarded the Ibadan Ph.D. in Film Dramaturgy and Generational Literature which he earned in 2005.

Prof. 'Diran Ademiju-Bepo's informal

teaching career began when he taught Playwriting, Dramatic Literature and Use of English respectively at the University of Ibadan as a Teaching Assistant, between 1994 and 2000 and has been on the Faculty of Nigeria's premier film school, the National Film Institute, Jos, as a Visiting Senior Lecturer/Resource Person since 2003, where he has taught and still teaches such courses as Acting and Presenting for the Screen, Film and Literature, Film and Society, among others.

From Campus journalism, he became an astute media practitioner, and worked with two reputable State-owned organizations, the Sketch Press Limited, Ibadan

(owned by the 5 South-West States, Nigeria) between 1993 and 2001, and the Fountain Newspapers and Publishing Limited, Ado Ekiti (Ekiti State) from 2001 to 2002 and rose through the Editorial ranks from a Proof Reader to an Associate Editor / Acting Editor before joining the Federal Public Service through the Nigerian Film Corporation in November 2002 as a Senior Programmes Officer. On resumption, he became the Desk Officer for the then National Film Festival, later rebranded with his efforts as Zuma Film Festival (2002-2006). He later served as the Registrar, Motion Picture Council of Nigeria (MOPICON) (2006-2008), and Head, Industry Support Services, a Unit under the Directorate of Operations (2008-2010) from where he left as an

Assistant Chief Programmes Officer in 2010, to begin his formal teaching career with the University of Jos, Jos, Nigeria as a Lecturer I. He was promoted Senior Lecturer in 2013, Reader in 2016 and announced a Professor of Theatre and Film Studies in 2021 with effect from October 1st, 2019.

In 2012, in furtherance of deeper understanding of his profession, he was sponsored to attend the New York Film Academy, under the auspices of the TETFund and earned a Diploma in Digital Filmmaking. 

rofessor Olusola Anthony Fosudo was born on the 18th of March 1958 at Ejinrin in Lagos State into the family of Pa James Oshintayo and Otunba Rebecca Adejoke Fosudo. He started his early education at Emmanuel School, Italupe, Ijebu Ode, from where he proceeded to Nazareth College, Ibonwon, Epe, where he obtained his West African School Certificate in 1975. He also obtained a Teacher's Grade II Certificate from Muslim Teachers Training College, Surulere, Lagos in 1977. Between 1977 to 1989 when he clocked 31, young Olusola has through determination and hard work, obtained the following certificates and degrees:-Certificate in Dramatic Arts (CDA), (1980, Ife); Diploma in Modern Salesmanship, (1980, London, UK); Diploma in Theatre Arts (1985, Ibadan) and the Degrees of Bachelor of Arts BA, (1988) Master of Arts MA (1989) and Doctor of Philosophy PhD in Theatre Arts (2008, all at UI, Ibadan).

In primary school, she led her school's cultural group to inter-school competitions in traditional dances with wins. As a

multi-linguist, while in secondary school, at graduation ceremonies, she led different ethnic dances, which left many wondering as to where she hails from.

Prof. Iyeh obtained her first degree in Performing Arts (Dance Major) in 1991 from the University of Ilorin, Kwara State. She obtained her Master's degree from the Department of English and Modern European Languages, Edo State University, Ekpoma, with a stress in (choreography) in 1999. She proceeded to bag a Ph.D. degree in African Dance from the Institute of African Studies, University of Ibadan in 2008. Prof. Iyeh began her academic career in the Department of English and Modern European Languages, Edo State University, in 1993, as a graduate assistant. Years later she became a pioneer staff of the Department of Theatre and Media Arts, where she rose through the ranks to become a full professor of dance in 2016 which earned her the place as the first female dance professor in Nigeria.

Prof. Iyeh has served in various administrative capacities, first as the Corper's Liaison Officer (CLO) Dustse-Ma Local Government Area of Kastina State 1991 -1992; Secretary General (NAWACS) National Association of Women Academics, AAU Chapter, 2001 -2008; P.R.O. Among her online comedies are Madam Abeni in "sekin out" valentine zanku, Abeni is president, Abeni and EFCC etc. She is the initiator organizer and Chief choreographer of Theatre La Danza from 2009-till date. Theatre La danza is a major annual dance programme in Ambrose Alli University with over 1,500 viewers per sitting. It attracts artists and dance troupes from different parts of Nigeria. Prof. Iyeh has three published dance research books to her credit two published plays and poems and numerous articles in both local and international journals and books. She is a resource person both to the academic community and the society at large. She has some distinguished awards to her credit. Prof. Iyeh is an ordained Pastor in Word Fountain Assembly Church, Benin City. She is happily married to Pastor Augustine Nnamdi Iyeh and their marriage is blessed with lovely children. She is the current President of ADSPON.

Delivers Lead City University's Maiden Faculty of Arts Public Lecture



he General Manager/CEO National Theatre Lagos, Prof Sunday E. Ododo has called on Nigeria's tertiary institutions to equip graduates with the practical orientation that will prepare them for life outside the university as well equip them with the right efficiency and proficiency to fit into the labour market.

Delivering the maiden Faculty of Arts

Public Lecture of Lead City University, Ibadan on May 16th at the University's International Conference Centre, Prof Ododo bemoaned the skills gap that currently exists amongst graduates of tertiary institutions which he said makes them unemployable. In his lecture titled: "Reengineering University's Graduates for Relevance in Industry", the one-time National President of the Society of Nigerian Theatre Artists (SONTA) and Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Letters (FNAL) hinted that the labour market needs a workforce that can apply skills to generate profit while universities appear to merely provide knowledge, with little or no practical orientation to its graduates.

To stem this tide, Professor Ododo was of the view that the current Core Curriculum Minimum Academic Standard (CCMAS) would go a long a way in shaping and preparing university graduates to

become more relevant and competitive in their specializations as programmes in the universities would now be taught to reflect current realities of the 21st century. He further stressed the need to start divesting knowledge to include entrepreneurial orientation and skills. This way, he said, graduates are not only prepared to make organizations and companies they would work for more profitable but would also develop a consciousness of self-employment and business mindedness thereby becoming employers of labour themselves.

Prof Ododo also suggested that lecturers require the exposure of practice outside the four walls of the university as some lecturers, as argued in some quarters, become complacent and lose track of current trends in their fields of study. This gap he said could be filled if training and research funds are made available for them to collaborate and share experiences with other colleagues and professionals in their fields or with common interdisciplinary interests across global scales. In his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof Kabiru A. Adeyemo thanked the Guest Lecturer, Prof Ododo for finding time to visit Lead City University, Ibadan and was full of praise for the new insights being generated by the public lecture.

The Dean of Arts, Prof Donald Odeleye in his speech also reiterated that the 21st century with all life's challenges is a big opportunity for self-expression, international growth and collaboration. He said the Faculty's Public lecture is game-changer of sorts because "up till now, the employability of Nigerian university graduates is in question. The reason for lecture he added, is to contextualise our challenges as a country and get more incisive reflections on the way forward. Highlights of the event featured dance performances from students of Department of Performing Arts and Film Studies, presentation of books and other reading resource materials by the Guest lecturer to the university.

he Department of Performing Arts and Film Studies, Lead City University, Ibadan has inducted 170 students admitted during the 2021/2022 and 2022/2023 academic sessions. In a colourful ceremony that featured breathtaking performances and displays by the fresh students, the Head of Department, Dr Emmanuel Uzoji remarked that the induction ceremony is important activity that introduces the newbie to the world of the theatre, which he said presents a universe of endless mutations that that takes the artist on a voyage of limitless opportunities.

he National Theatre has been bestowed with an award of excellence as a commendable symbol of friendship, diplomacy, and unity between Nigeria and Ghana advancing its course through sports, culture, trade, commerce, and entertainment. This was at Ghana's 66th Independence Thanksgiving Reception which took place in Lagos where the management team of the National Theatre led by GM/CEO Prof. Sunday Ododo was received with pomp and pageantry.

Prof Sunday Ododo who was also the chairman of the occasion appreciated the chief host of the event, Joseph Anayo Odebeatu, CEO of Ojez Entertainment for the honour and privilege given to his team and the National Theatre. He went ahead to commend him for his efforts in bringing the two strongholds of West Africa, Nigeria and Ghana under the same roof. He equated the relationship between the two countries as one of healthy sibling rivalry. Prof Ododo also commended the host for using the tool of entertainment as an olive branch between the countries. Revealing that the relationship Ojez Entertainment and the National Theatre has with Ghana is a commendable and praiseworthy one.

The General Manager of Sparkling FM, Effiong Nyong was in attendance and gave a remarkable address on the pre-colonial and post-colonial relationship between Nigeria and Ghana and how they have been able to stay connected and maintain deep relations through music, sports, culture and entertainment. 

History of Sam Loco Efe

am Loco Efe was born in Enugu on 25th December 1945. His father was a warder, by name– Arase Efeimwonkiyeke. He was a Benin man who worked in Eastern Nigeria and his mother was a petty trader who sold akara. He spent his childhood in the town of Abakaliki in presentday Ebonyi State. In fact, he spent much of his years in Abakaliki. When he was in primary school, he lost his father. He had to support his mother in her business which made him spend longer than usual years before graduating from primary school. He started acting while still in school when a theatre group came to stage a play called "The Doctor In Spite of Himself", afterwards he discussed with members of the group about the theatre and performance arts. In elementary school, he was a member of various groups including a drama society that performed a rendition of Shakespeare's Julius Caesar at an Eastern regional arts festival in Abakaliki, the play came last in the drama competition but Efe was noted as the best actor which earned him a scholarship to complete elementary school. After finishing elementary school, he attended various secondary schools and was active in the drama society, organizing a performance of The Doctor in Spite of Himself and a play called Vendetta.

After secondary school, he was a member of a traveling theatre group and played soccer earning the moniker locomotive later shortened as loco. That was how his name Loco came to being. During the Biafran genocidal War, Efe fought on the Biafra side until he returned to Benin in 1968. He saw himself as an Igbo man and a Biafran before anything. While in Benin in the 1960s, he started the Ovonranwen Theatre Group with their debut production being Ogierhiakhi's Obaiwape. However, his earnings from acting was meagre and thereafter, he traveled to Lagos to seek better career opportunities and to explore a career in football. He got his first job in 1972 working for Michelin tyre company. He applied for the position without



knowing how to drive which was a requirement for the job. He learned how to drive a day before the interview. During the interview, he passed the oral interview and failed the driving test but honesty about his error in judgment won over the interviewer.

He worked for Michelin selling tyres in Lagos, Ijebu Ode and Abeokuta. He soon left Michelin to work for Dunlop Tyres as a Senior Sales Representative in the Tyres and Allied products division. While working for Dunlop in Benin City, he was a cast member of NTA Benin's television series, *Hotel de Jordan* and also performed in a rendition of Ola Rotimi's *The Gods are Not to Blame*. In 1977, he left sales for a career in theatre. He auditioned and got the lead part of *Langbodo*, a play by Dapo Adelugba presented during FESTAC. After the end of FESTAC, Adelugba introduced him to a friend of his at University of Ibadan about opportunities in theatre. Adelugba's friend was able to get Efe a position as a senior artiste in the institution.

Sam Loco would later become a household name and one of the early pioneers of Nollywood. He made the world laugh. He featured in *Things Fall Apart* TV series in the 1980s. Some movies he featured in include: *Tom and Jerry, Final World Cup, Long John, Ukwa, Ak d , My Love, I Want to Harvest You, The Return of Anunuebe* and many others. Sam Loco Efe died in his hotel room at Amak h a, Owere, Imo State on 7th August 2011. Till date, nobody knows the cause of his death. Ventolin was found with him when the room was broken open. Report has it that Sam Loco has been an asthmatic patient.

Runsewe said as an astute believer in the Nigerian project, he will leave no stone unturned in his quest to reposition the Arts, Culture and Tourism sector to be the mainstay of the Nigerian economy. The Director General who reechoed his respect for SONTA promised to collaborate with the association in areas that will provide a veritable springboard to realize their mandates. Highlight of the visit was the decoration of the Director General with the title of Hsonta.

PROFESSOR GOWON AMA DOKI, FSONTA, MNAL PRESIDENT- SOCIETY OF NIGERIA THEATRE (ARTISTS (SONTA)

t is that time of the year for our dear society -SONTA, when we all, as professional colleagues, gather on a particular campus to celebrate our common existence as thespians, share results of our individual researches and felicitate one another. This year, as it has become our tradition in recent times, we collectively took the decision to honour one of our own, Professor Tor Joe Iorapuu, himself a former Editor and Vice-President of SONTA, who was appointed Vice-Chancellor, of the prestigious Benue State University, Makurdi, by granting hosting rights to Benue State University, upon his request. I am happy to state that we made the best decision as this gentleman VC, has gone out of his way to ensure that we have one of the most successful conferences. While I was writing this welcome speech, I received the cheering news that one of us, the first Professor of Dance and Choreography in Nigeria,

Professor Rasaki Ojo Bakare, was re-nominated to serve as Commissioner in His Excellency's cabinet. This indeed, is heartwarming and we as a society owe a debt of gratitude to this great man for recognizing hard work and professionalism. I encourage other Excellences to take a cue from Governor Oyebanji.


